

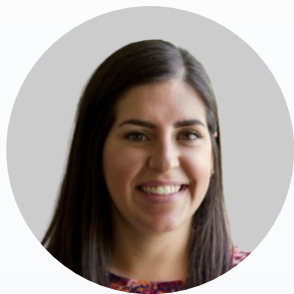

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# Updates to May 24 Data Collection

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LEAs will be asked to respond to two surveys:

Updated AB 86 survey (school instructional modes) for ongoing statewide data collection to focus on summer programming

One-time survey to support distribution of Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits

# What is Pandemic EBT (P-EBT)?

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- Pandemic EBT or P-EBT provides food benefits to school age children who are eligible for free or reduced price school meals but who may not have ready access to those meals because of COVID-19 related school facility closures.
- P-EBT benefits are significant - up to \$123 per month for 10 months per eligible child. We estimate CA has the opportunity to issue nearly \$5 billion dollars in additional food benefits.
- To operate P-EBT, CA must develop a P-EBT plan that is reviewed and approved by USDA. Per USDA guidance, this plan must include a method for establishing P-EBT eligibility that takes into account the instruction model (i.e. distance learning, hybrid instruction, or full-time in person instruction).

# P-EBT Eligibility

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P-EBT eligible children include those who during SY 2020-21 were:

1. Enrolled in a school participating in the federal School Breakfast or National School Lunch Programs; and
2. Eligible for free or reduced-price school meals; and
3. Assumed to be attending school via distance learning at least some days of the week.

Eligibility criteria #1 and #2 above are known to CDE. To establish #3 above, we need school administrators to provide us with the most commonly elected instructional model employed by each school in your district for each month of SY 2020-21.

# Definitions

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**Distance Learning:** Students are not receiving in-person instruction for any part of the instructional day or week. For the P-EBT survey, students should be counted as distance learning even if they pick up "grab-and-go" meals at the school site. This option should be selected when it applied to the majority of the students for the majority of the month.

**Hybrid Instruction:** Students are receiving instruction through a combination of in-person and distance learning and are not in-person for the full instructional week. For the P-EBT survey, students should be counted as hybrid learning even if they pick up "grab-and-go" meals at the school site. This option should be selected when it applied to the majority of the students for the majority of the month.

# Definitions (continued)

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**In-person Instruction:** Teachers and students are engaged in teaching and learning in the same physical environment on a designated school campus/learning environment. For the P-EBT survey, students should be counted as receiving full-time in-person instruction if they are receiving instruction in-person each instructional day during the full instructional week. This option should be selected when it applies to the majority of students for the majority of the month.

**Majority:** For the P-EBT survey, “majority of students” is defined as 50% or more of students enrolled at the school for each month. “Majority of the month” is defined as 50% or more of the instructional days for each month.

**No instruction:** For the P-EBT survey, “no instruction” is defined as school not in session that month, either in person or otherwise.

# P-EBT Benefits

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P-EBT benefit amounts will be determined by the most commonly elected instructional model for each school in your district. The “**most commonly elected instructional model**” is defined as the instructional model elected by the majority ( $\geq 50\%$ ) of enrolled students.

- Students eligible for free or reduced-price meals and attending schools reporting **distance learning** for the majority of students in a given month will receive \$123 in P-EBT food benefits for that month.
- Students eligible for free or reduced-price meals and attending schools reporting **hybrid instruction** for the majority of students in a given month will receive \$68 in P-EBT food benefits for that month

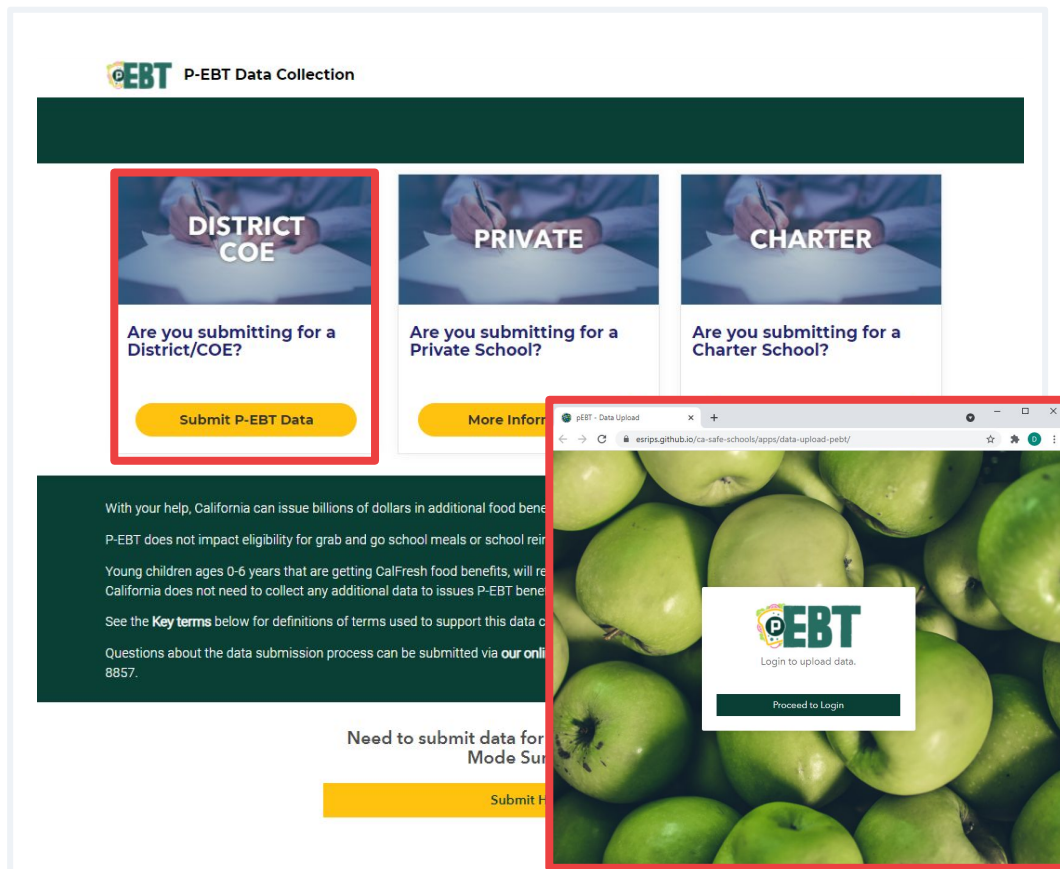

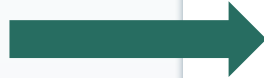
