# Regional Stay-At-Home Order



- [Order](#) announced by Governor Newsom on 12/3/20
- [Existing guidance](#) for schools remains in effect and unchanged
- When the Order takes effect in a region:
  - schools that have previously reopened for in-person instruction may remain open
  - schools may continue to bring students back for in-person instruction under the [Elementary School Waiver Process](#) or [Cohorting Guidance](#)
  - Reference: Section 2(e) of the Order

# California Department of Public Health Guidance

- Update to Blueprint for a Safer Economy & Data Chart on 12/08/20
- Outlines requirements for safe conditions, testing, and tracing
- Specifies that schools may be required to close if certain percentages of staff and students are diagnosed with COVID-19

# Cal/OSHA Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) to Protect Workers from COVID-19

# Cal/OSHA Emergency Temporary Standards - Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP)

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- Builds on IIPP and state COVID-19 prevention guidance
- Written, site specific COVID-19 Prevention Program
- Communication with employees: symptoms, exposures, hazards, policies, testing
- Identifying, evaluating and correcting hazards
- Physical distancing, face coverings, and additional engineering, administrative and PPE controls
- Procedures to respond to and investigate COVID-19 cases in the workplace
- Training
- Testing and excluding from work employees who are exposed to COVID-19 or test positive while they are an infection risk
- Maintaining records of cases and reporting requirements to Cal/OSHA and local health departments
- Responding to outbreaks

# Cal/OSHA ETS to Protect Workers from COVID-19

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- How are the Cal/OSHA standards aligned with the CDPH guidance?
  - Where are discrepancies and how will these be resolved?
  - If an LEA notices differences between county health guidance and Cal/OSHA, what are the recommendations?
- Is the employer required to develop a written COVID-19 Prevention Program that addresses each of the standards?
  - When is this plan due?
  - What do they do with the plan (send it somewhere, file, put on website)?
  - Does the plan require board approval?

# Cal/OSHA ETS to Protect Workers from COVID-19

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- Could you clarify the requirements in the standards that speak to the adults and not the students in the setting? For example, in reference to the requirements of masks and 6 foot distancing, etc.
- Please explain what is required of the employer in reference to the requirement: “Offer testing to an employee at no cost and during working hours in the event of a potential COVID-19 work-related exposure.”
  - Does this require everyone to be tested before they can come back to work?
  - How often must an employer test that does not apply to an outbreak?

# Cal/OSHA ETS to Protect Workers from COVID-19

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- Please define an “exposed workplace.” When you use the word workplace, do you mean the entire campus? Please provide an example.
- Please describe how an employer should respond to an “outbreak” (three or more COVID-19 cases in an exposed workplace within a 14-day period) or a “major outbreak” (20 or more COVID-19 cases in an exposed workplace within a 30-day period).
  - Does this mean all school personnel have to be tested and the school has to close?



What are some recommendations for schools to consider when developing or updating safety plans to align with Cal/OSHA ETS?
