Learning Acceleration

Covid 19

School interruptions, distance learning, accessibility to education contributing to reduced gains in measured learning



Disproportionate Effects

Reduced gains in measured learning pronounced in most vulnerable student groups



CCEE to administer, in partnership with selected COE(s), evidence-based professional education for educators that can support learning acceleration in mathematics, literacy, and language development (\$45 million)

What are the RFP's Goals?



Develop a **robust statewide infrastructure** to ensure educators **anywhere in the state** have access to high quality professional learning (System of Support)



Show the impact of the evidence-based accelerated learning strategy for students with high needs, English Learners, students with disabilities, and low-income students



Create or expand existing **evidence-based** professional development opportunities or guidance for educators, paraprofessionals, and administrators to address students' learning recovery and acceleration

Below are the California Callaborative for Educational Excellence's ("CCEE") responses to questions and requests for clarification received from prospective Respondents, regarding the posted Request for Proposals for Learning Acceleration System Grant (the "RFP"), issued on November 30, 2021. Questions and requests for clarifications may be submitted on an origing basis and CCEE will provide a response that will be posted to the CCEE website. CCEE staff has endeavored to respond as thoroughly as possible, and cited relevant language from the RFP where appropriate. Questions and requests for clarification that are similar or on the same topic have been grouped together for ease of navigation and response. Questions that were submitted are not necessarily provided verbatim as submitted, and may have been edited for clarify, but have not been altered in substance. CCEE will presume that all Respondents will have read and understood all of the responses provided herein upon submitted of any Proposal. Respondents may submit additional questions and requests for clarification or additional information specific to this Addendum, in writing only, to Belinda Gaspar (the "CCEE Contact." bassare/Boccee-ca.org.).

Content Areas/Methods of Delivery

1. What is required for a complete Proposal?

RESPONSE: Applicants must email a complete and signed Grant Proposal PDF (Appendix C) to Ms. Bellinda Gaspara <u>bearpar@ccee-ca.or</u> with the subject line: "Learning Acceleration System Grant RFP Submission". Assurances, certifications, terms, and conditions are requirements of Respondents and grantees as a condition of receiving funds. The superintendent of the LEA, acting as the fiscal agent, must agree, sign, and return the following with their Proposal:

- Project Statement of Assurances (Appendix E)
- Lobbying, U.S. Department of Education Form ED 80-0013
- Drug-Free Workplace, CDE-100DF

While not required, Respondents may include outside testimonials from other people, businesses, and organizations, such as institutions of higher education, other COEs, nonprofits, districts or schools which support the Respondents' claims of success and promises to deliven Applicants should include supporting evidence and forms as one zip file. These forms may include: the budget, budget narrative, certifications and assurances, and letters of support.

2. How many grants will be awarded?

RESPONSE: CCEE and MCOE will determine the number of grants that will be awarded based on the completed responses received. Once proposals are submitted. CCEE, and MCOE will also determine the content areas (math, literacy, and/or language development) that will be awarded.
