AB 86: Expanded Learning Opportunities Grants

- \$4.6 billion, one-time funding
- Expanded learning, supplemental instruction, and social-emotional supports
- Funds can be spent now August 31, 2022
- Goes to local education agencies (LEAs) based on LCFF allocation





Declining Enrollment Across California

4 in 5 districts

saw a decline in kindergarten enrollment

3 in 5 charter schools

saw a decrease in kindergarteners

Research Takeaways

- Build cohesion between academic and enrichment portions of the day (include full-day staff for continuity)
- Build in time for mentorship for newer staff
- Provide quiet and/or nap time for incoming Kinders
- Include on-site field trips & outside time
- Include "floaters" in your site staff who can provide additional and individualized student support

The FELA Method





High Quality Instructional Materials

- Pre K = <u>Letter recognition and phonemic awareness</u>
- K-2 = IBRDS (phonics instruction methodology)
- 3rd = Multisyllabic decoding instruction

Materials: 25 decks with scripted lessons per grade; alphabet wall cards; handheld sound-spelling letter cards; sight word cards
