- Support for and progress towards data collection plan
- Development of logic model linking activities to outcomes
- Operational definitions for outcomes

- Measuring and reporting on impact at multiple levels
- Examining sustainability of work moving forward
- Focusing on local context

- Breadth of available data; new data available in near future
- Tracking student growth
- Overlap across state-funded initiatives; aligning efforts across evaluations
- Including other measures/proxy measures beyond test scores (e.g., SEL)

# What do you foresee as challenges for using state-level data for your evaluation project (All Teams)?

- Availability of specific data elements of interest
- Variability across projects (e.g., geography, subject area)
- Timeline for detecting program effects; measuring lagging data
- Measuring impact at student level

# What kind of supports are needed to successfully launch evaluation activities this upcoming year (New Project Teams)?

- Building mutual trust and accountability with program leads
- Development of logic model with program leads
- Management and communication from CCEE/CDE/SBE

- Digging deeper into student data collection
- Planning sustainability goals into the evaluation process
- Streamlining data requests to avoid duplication and overburden
