### What are Balanced Assessment Systems?

Using the right combination of assessments to supply a variety of information to support different types of educational decision-making is at the heart of what is known as "balanced assessment systems."

There are different assessments for different purposes, uses, and stakeholders.

- → State policymakers and school and district leaders need assessment information that can be aggregated across classrooms or schools.
- → Classroom teachers need qualitative information on student thinking to adjust their daily instructional interactions targeted to specific content and skills.
- → Classroom teachers also need to evaluate student learning at certain points in time to report to parents/caregivers and students about student achievement of state content standards.





### Balanced Assessment System Project Goal & Design

Create tools and resources that support the **evaluation of local assessment system quality** and that **can be implemented in a locally paced and independent manner** across the diversity of California schools and districts



Micro-course with professional learning modules and associated tools shared with pilot LEAs



Pilot LEAs provide feedback on the quality, relevance, and usability of the professional learning modules and associated tools for locally paced and independent review implementation





### What is a Local Assessment System Review?

A collection, analysis, and review of all of the district, school, and classroom assessments administered to a student over the course of a year in one grade level for the core content areas (ELA, math, science, & social studies).

#### Answers the key questions:

- → How can the collection of assessments administered to students over the year (both within the classroom and outside the classroom) best support our vision of high-quality instruction?
- → How can we design a system of assessments to ensure that different decision-makers have the information they need to make better educational decisions that ultimately support student learning? What assessments need to stay? What assessments need to go?



### **LEA Teams**

- Identify District (and School) Leadership team
  - Team should stay consistent across the pilot
  - o Who is the Champion?
  - o Who is the Driver?
- Who should be part of the team?
  - Those with direct knowledge of the assessments being reviewed
  - Those who will be able to provide insight into the assessments collected, analyzed, and evaluated in the review
  - We suggest members range from district/school leadership to classroom teachers based upon the grade and content areas selected as the focus of the review.







# LEA Responsibilities

Watch pre-recorded professional learning modules and conduct local assessment system review by June 2024

- Modules will be watched between February and early June
- Review plan will be completed in February to help set-up the review
- Local assessment system review will be completed by early June
