Noted that legislative partners also spend time with us and the importance of the voices of the AC in shaping some policy and design thinking for the state. ## HOT TOPICS: POLICY & LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Our Hot Topics discussion focused on a several “Hot Topic” concerns found in the field. Christine Frazier thanked the AC and noted it’s been eight years since the conception of the CCEE Advisory Council. The AC discussed several impacts related to the current state budget and policy.

- A question was raised on how COEs are going to respond to the new Williams Requirements. Questions about what type of structures at the county level are in place to guide districts and accomplish what appears to be an increasing number of LEAs that will be identified under Williams.

- Williams Requirements kept the same criteria, but the performance levels have gone down. COE doesn't have the funding or the staffing to do the reviews.
- Concern of surveillance around LCAP and LCAP approvals. A return to the old compliance level, where funds are being selected for schools, is a disturbing trend. There are a lot of new compliance models coming into play as the capacity of staff diminishes due to funding, coupled with the additional obligation to provide Differentiated Assistance to Charter Schools.
- CAL PADS - concerned because it is used to track a lot of things. Does anyone have any further information on what is being required for CAL PADS?
- Further discussions on various topics were discussed and noted by the CCEE to bring up with State Partners regarding concerns.

### CCEE HIGHLIGHTS

Executive Director Matt Navo highlighted that the CCEE has been very busy and complimented the leadership of the center for Transformative Systems for Equitable Educational (TSEE) outcomes with the Statewide System of Support (SSOS).

Dr. Chris Hartley, Deputy Director of TSEE Center, and Senior Advisor, Mindy Fattig, shared the following highlights regarding the SSOS.

- We now have a [SSOS landing page](#) as a place to communicate out, what is the SSOS, where you can receive support, and a place for all of us to communicate from.
- The SSOS is broken into three tiers of support: Universal Supports for everyone! Targeted/Supplemental Support, and Intensive Support.
- Mindy Fattig shared the System of Support Tools.
  - SSOS Core working group reports a 2-year project to identify SSOS recommendations for improvement.
  - Community Engagement - [CEI Learning Modules](#). About increasing community engagement. Best practices taken from districts and counties in the field.
  - Statewide System of Support [Resource Hub](#): This is a one stop shop for all the resources that have been created by state-funded initiatives. These are available, evidence-based practices. Sustainable, universal resources are available to the field. There are a variety of ways to search for these resources as well using the Resource Hub. Searchable [Statewide System of Support Directory](#): Trying to bring equity and access across the state. You can search by any

of the initiatives in California, find contact information and individual websites. This can be updated within 24 hours of staff changes.
